PROGRAM ENTRY

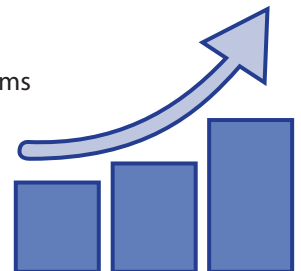
